

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Diocese of Peoria, Spalding Scholarship Application Information

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2020-21 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Parents are encouraged to apply online at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. This is the only step needed to be eligible for the Spalding Scholarship Assistance. Deadline date for the completed application is **April 10, 2020**. Notification of grant awards will be made by late May/early June.

IL Tax Credit Scholarship Program Information (Empower Illinois)

Families can take advantage of the Tax Credit Scholarship program offered through the State of Illinois. This scholarship program is separate from assistance received by completing the FACTS application. The school highly recommends all families seeking assistance from the Diocese and parishes to also complete the application for this scholarship. This is a highly competitive scholarship, and registration starts **January 15, 2020**. See attachment for details and go to: <https://empowerillinois.org/> for more information.

Parish Financial Assistance

Our school parishes subsidize tuition for registered parishioners attending K-8 at Corpus Christi Catholic School. The actual cost to educate one student is over \$7,500 per year. The subsidies received from the parishes help to reduce the tuition for each child by over \$2,000. Families in need for additional tuition assistance may be eligible for support from their respective parish. Parish assistance is offered to qualifying families after the scholarships from the Diocese and Empower Illinois have been awarded. The application for the Diocese scholarships is reviewed by the parish administration for families needing additional support. Notification of parish assistance to families is made in June. It is recommended to reach out to your respective parish office if families need the additional parish assistance.



SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW DO I APPLY FOR AN EMPOWER ILLINOIS SCHOLARSHIP?

The application is a two-step process. First, visit the [Empower Illinois Website](#) opening **Wednesday, January 15, at 6:30 p.m. CT with submission at 7:00 p.m. CT** to reserve your place in line. You will complete a brief, two-page online form containing parent's name, contact information, and child's name. This will time stamp your application.

After reserving your place in line, you can access the application through your student portal on **Friday, January 17**. You will receive instructions by email about setting up your student portal after your reservation has been completed. We will begin awarding scholarships on **Thursday, January 30**. Scholarship awards are subject to the availability of funds at your school of choice. However, we recommend you submit your application before **Monday, January 27** to increase your chances of receiving a scholarship. Failing to submit your application before **January 27** may cause other students who have completed their application to receive a scholarship before you, even if you reserved a place in line in front of them.

IF I HAVE MULTIPLE CHILDREN, DO I NEED TO MAKE A RESERVATION FOR EACH CHILD?

No. We encourage you to include all children on a single reservation.

WILL I NEED TO SUBMIT ANY DOCUMENTS TO RESERVE MY SPOT IN LINE?

No. The application is a two-step process: reserve and apply. You will not submit any documents during the reservation step. Eligibility documents are only needed when you are completing the full application.

WHAT DOCUMENTS DO I NEED TO COMPLETE THE FULL APPLICATION?

You will need **proof of Illinois residency** and your **adjusted gross income** to apply. Choose your most recent household and income documents, and use documents from the same year throughout your application.

Proof of Illinois Residency

ONE of the following for the parent/custodian completing the application:

- » Illinois driver's license
- » Illinois identification card (issued by the Secretary of State)
- » Utility bill in the custodian's name
- » Statement of benefits from WIC
- » Statement of benefits from SNAP
- » W-2
- » 1099
- » Residential lease in the parent/custodian's name
- » Federal Tax Form 1040 with current address

Adjusted Gross Income

ONE of the following for the household:

- » Federal Tax Return, pages 1 & 2*
- » W-2
- » 1099/s
- » Year-end pay stub
- » Letter, on letterhead, from employer/s indicating cash wages paid

* If your federal tax return is not available to you and you receive WIC or SNAP benefits, you may submit your statement of WIC or SNAP benefits.

HOW MUCH TIME DO I HAVE TO COMPLETE THE FULL APPLICATION?

Applicants can reserve their place in line beginning **Wednesday, January 15, at 7:00 p.m.** You will complete a brief, two-page online form containing parent's name, contact information, and child's name. This will time stamp your application.

After reserving your place in line, you can access the student application in your portal on **Friday, January 17.** We will begin awarding scholarships on **Thursday, January 30.** While there is no deadline, we recommend you submit your application before **Monday, January 27** to increase your chances of receiving a scholarship subject to the availability of funds. As mentioned above, failing to submit your application before **January 27** may cause other students who have completed their application to receive a scholarship before you, even if you reserved a place in line in front of them.

WHAT LANGUAGES WILL THE APPLICATION BE AVAILABLE IN?

The application will be available in Spanish, English and Polish.

WHAT IF I DON'T KNOW WHAT SCHOOL MY CHILD WILL BE ATTENDING?

Please list three schools that your children are likely to attend, and/or your children are applying to attend. This will increase the likelihood of matching your application to available funds. When you complete the application, you will be asked to place these schools in priority order (first, second, and third). The way you rank the schools is the order in which we will try to match funds. No awards will be finalized until enrollment has been confirmed by your school of choice.

ARE ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR THOSE WHO RECEIVED A TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP LAST YEAR FROM AN ORGANIZATION OTHER THAN EMPOWER ILLINOIS?

If a family received a scholarship from a scholarship granting organization other than Empower Illinois last year, they may be required to provide a letter from the school they attended on that scholarship. **A family must provide this letter if they do not meet any other Category 1 criteria or have an income greater than 300% FPL.** This letter will be required during part two of the application. The letter should be on school letterhead and include:

- » Student name
- » School name
- » School year the student received the scholarship for
- » Name of the organization that provided the scholarship

WHEN WILL I RECEIVE CONFIRMATION THAT MY APPLICATION WAS RECEIVED?

You will receive a confirmation email from Empower Illinois within an hour of submitting your application.

WHEN WILL I BE NOTIFIED OF MY APPLICATION STATUS?

Empower Illinois will notify you of your application status based on your self-reported data within 10 business days of receiving your application. Your application will be reviewed and verified once funds become available at one of your school choices.

WHEN WILL I BE NOTIFIED IF I AM RECEIVING A SCHOLARSHIP?

Scholarships will be granted beginning January 30, 2020 on a rolling basis as funds are available. Check your portal page for updates on your application and award status.
